ADDENDUM #1
(Issued: September 3, 2009)

This Addendum #1 is made part of the Request for Proposals-Competitive Negotiation for the Mobile Data Project, Cowlitz County Sheriff's Office, to the same extent as if originally included therein.

The Scope of Work under this Request for Proposals constitutes a "public work" under Washington State law. Federal funds are also involved. When preparing proposals, Contractors should take into consideration statutory legal requirements such as payment of prevailing wages, payment/provision for performance bonds and sales tax implications.

WAGE RATES AND PAYMENT:

The Contractor will pay no less than the prevailing wage rates. If the prevailing wage rates or fringe benefits increase during the performance of the contract, the Contractor will pay the higher amounts. No increase in prevailing wage or fringe benefits will be grounds for any additional compensation to the Contractor. The Contractor will pay all fees required by the Department of Labor and Industries in connection with the administration of the prevailing wage requirements.

For a contract in excess of Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000), a Contractor required to pay the prevailing rate of wages shall post in a location readily visible to workers at the job site, a copy of a statement of intent to pay prevailing wages approved by the industrial statistician of the Department of Labor and Industries under RCW 39.12.040; and the address and telephone number of the industrial statistician of the Department of Labor and Industries where a complaint or inquiry concerning prevailing wages may be made.

Applications for payment will not be processed without Cowlitz County's receipt of the Intent to Pay Prevailing Wage approved by the industrial statistician of the Department of Labor and Industries for the Contractor and each and every Subcontractor. Final payment will be held pending completion of the contract and receipt of all affidavits of wages paid from the Contractor and each and every Subcontractor, required releases from the Department of Labor and Industries, the Department of Revenue and the Employment Security Department.

The Contractor shall post the current State of Washington Department of Labor and Industries prevailing Wages Rates and Benefits at the job site in a conspicuous location.
